MHST ensures that individuals with mental health challenges receive the necessary treatment and support through a collaborative effort with behavioral health professionals, law enforcement, jails, medical practitioners, judicial entities, and the public. As a member of the Association of Threat Professionals (ATAP) Maria used her training, experience and knowledge to quickly and effectively manage high profile individuals at risk of endangering the community. Additional assignments included the Crimes Against Children

Unit and the Fraud & Elder Abuse Unit.

Maria specialized in several areas during her career: Child Forensic Interviewer, Crisis Negotiator, Peer Support, Honor Guard, General Instructor, Terrorism Liaison Officer and Mental Health First Aid Instructor.

During her 18 years as a Crisis Negotiator Maria became a lead trainer in all aspects of Crisis Negotiations, including Active Listening Skills and De-Escalation. Maria took an active role in coordinating monthly, quarterly and specialized trainings for team members, including scenario-based joint training with the Tactical Team, EOD and Search & Rescue.
